# Lenny De Ice Black Music Legacy Awards

Founder Wayne George, born and raised in Leyton, is delighted to announce the launch of the Waltham Forest Black Music Legacy Awards. This new initiative begins with a dynamic series of events and activities celebrating Black History, honouring our diverse community while paying tribute to Leyton-born music pioneer Lennie De Ice. His legacy will be carried forward by supporting emerging Black electronic music producers and creatives across Waltham Forest.

Partnering with Rendezvous Projects, Wayne—also known as DJ Dlux—fondly recalls the encouragement he received from his friend Lennie De Ice in the early 1990s. That support fuels his passionate belief in nurturing new talent while celebrating local Black music heritage.

Lennie De Ice, credited with pioneering Jungle music through his groundbreaking 1991 track We Are I.E., sadly passed away in December 2024.

Alongside this initiative, Creative Engagement Services CIC also delivers as one of the borough's Space4All Youth Hub providers, running free weekly sessions for 11-25 year olds. These include mentoring, multi-sports, podcast-making, crafts, cooking, gaming, and music and video production.



#### 3. Support Wellbeing

We will ensure children and young people feel safer going to and from school. We believe that if children feel safe leaving school, this will have a positive impact on their emotional wellbeing and allow them to continue to thrive in education.
